The Department of East Asian Studies seeks 1 Course Instructor for the following course:

EAS273H1F – MODERN CHINESE CITIES

This course offers a critical review of the history and historiography of modern Chinese cities. Focusing on the development of specific Chinese cities, the course emphasizes understanding the socio-cultural production of space as well as analytical reading of landscape, urban imagery, and urban writings.

Qualifications

- Preference will be given to EAS PhD students.
- Knowledge of, and evidence of ability to teach, the subject area.
- Willingness to replicate the pedagogy and evaluation techniques employed in the regular teaching of this course

Duties will include:

- Preparation of lectures and teaching a weekly two hour class, Mondays, 6 – 8 pm
- Adaptation of syllabus
- Development & administration of grades, course assignments, tests and exams
- Providing scheduled office hours for academic counselling of students

Estimate of TA Support:	105 hours
Estimated Course Enrolment:	80 students
Rate of Pay:	\$7,900.00 (including vacation pay)
