EAS274H1S – POPULAR CULTURE IN EAST ASIA

Through various forms of popular culture in the 20th century, this course explores the cultural contexts and social trajectories of China, Japan and Korea. Forms of popular culture studied include art, visual culture, consumer habits, foodways, advertising, music, and fashion.

Qualifications

Successful applicants will be in an MA or PhD program, preferably in EAS, with some knowledge of the subject matter and experience critically engaging with popular culture.

Duties will include:

- Grading student coursework up to and including the final paper/exam.
- Other duties may be assigned by the supervisor

Duties of this position shall be performed at the St. George Campus.
