The Department of East Asian Studies seeks 2 Teaching Assistants for the following course:

EAS110Y1Y – MODERN STANDARD KOREAN I

This course is designed to help students build communication skills in the Korean language. Through an integration of listening, speaking, reading and writing, it aims to provide a solid foundation in beginning-level Korean. This course assumes that students do not have any prior knowledge of Korean. Students must go through screening process conducted by the Department.

Qualifications

Successful applicants will be in an MA or PhD program, native or near-native fluency in Korean & an ability to communicate information clearly required, previous teaching and marking experience preferred.

Duties will include:

- Leading tutorials
- Marking assignments and exams
- Other duties may be assigned by the supervisor

Duties of this position shall be performed at the St. George Campus.

Hours of work: two positions available of 125 hours each

Estimated Course Enrolment: 60 students
